

Cherry Oatmeal Muffins

1 Cup old-fashioned rolled oats 1/3 cup toasted wheat germ 1/2 tsp. baking soda 3 tbs. olive oil 3/4 cup dried cherries

3/4 cup all-purpose flour 1/3 cup plus 1 tbs. sugar 1/2 tsp. salt 1 large egg

3/4 cup whole-wheat flour 1 tsp. baking powder 1 1/3 cups buttermilk 1 tbs. grated orange zest

- 1. Heat oven to 375°. Toast oats for 10 minutes; stir often. Put in bowl. Cool.
- 2. Add flours, germ, 1/3 cup sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt to oatmeal. Mix next 4 items in small bowl.
- 3. Pour buttermilk mixture in center of dry ingredients and stir just until combined. Add cherries. Pour into muffin cups. Top with remaining sugar. Bake 30 minutes. Mmmmmmmmm that sounds like it would taste good!!!!!

Citizens of Del City

The year 2003 was a very positive year for the City of Del City. The economic climate is beginning to improve and this next year will be even better. There have been several exciting things occur in our community that, over time, will pay large dividends to us. Two housing developments are under construction with approximately 174 homes projected. A third development has entered the design and engineering phase for presentation to the Planning Commission. Several new businesses have completed construction and have opened or are near opening: Albertson's at SE 29th and Sunnylane, Ford Funeral Home at Sooner and Reno, Gun World at SE 33rd and Sunnylane, Pelfry's Food Court across from Del City High School, McWirther's "The Gardens" west of Sunnylane on SE 15th, and the new complex at SE 15th and Sunnylane, home of Best Doughnut (with a drive-thru) and TCBY. These are all examples of the type of fine business establishments that can be enticed into our community. Negotiations with other business concerns are in the works at this time.

In addition, a new 4-story hotel has agreed to locate in Del City along the I-40 corridor with a projected opening date of September. This has been a banner year for street projects in the residential community, with several street projects already being completed. SE 31st, SE 33rd and SE 37th will be completed in the near future. SE 29th was completed last summer and SE 15th will be let for bid this spring. Major improvements have been made to the wastewater treatment plant, and initial engineering is soon to come on the water treatment plant, which should extend the useful life of the existing water plant built in 1966. Another major sewer line improvement project began near SE 25th and Vickie and engineering for the final phase of that system is in place with construction to begin in 2005. The installation of electrical service and a large group size pavilion will soon be available for use at Eagle Lake to hold special events. Restroom facilities are planned in our upcoming budget.

None of these projects could have been accomplished without the citizens' approval of the temporary sales tax a year ago. There have been several new hires within both the police and fire departments which will begin the process to replace lost positions due to the economic downturn, which affected not just Del City, but the entire nation. A new contract with our sanitation landfill has been approved, enhancing the service previously provided to the residents. The service that was provided only once a month has now been replaced with service that is provided six days a week at SE 74th and Bryant.

I would like to thank you, the citizens and business owners, for having faith in the City during the difficult times, and a big thanks to City Manger Mark Edwards who has devoted his time and energy to make positive things happen in the community. My hat's off to all the hard-working city employees who make this City tick, committee members, council and citizens that share the vision to move our great community forward. Last year, though tough, saw a marked improvement to the overall condition of the City and with the promise of a better future.
