They have the school activities on their mind and not being real careful, so please **watch out** for them. I hope everyone had time to take a good vacation this summer. It was a great August with a lot of almost like spring time weather. It sure has been nice to be able to get out in the evening and just enjoy visiting with neighbors. I wonder what the fall and winter holds for us, don't ask the weatherman because they will only guess or say a 50% chance.

My hint for the month, every 27 seconds a motor vehicle is stolen in the United States. Well friends there has been at least 17 vehicles stolen in our area in the past 11 months, so we are not exempt. Think about it, for every car owner, "Common Sense" is always the first step in theft prevention. Using common sense is also very affordable. A common sense approach to theft prevention includes such practices as always locking your car - no matter how briefly it will be unattended. For example, on cold winter mornings, many of us warm up our cars in our own driveways before leaving for work. Look at the basic elements of this scenario - the keys are in the ignition, the engine has been started and is running, and the car unlocked and unattended. You can't make it much easier for a thief to steal your car.

In addition to always locking your car's doors and windows, common sense theft prevention also includes such practices as parking in well-lit areas and never leaving your keys (or a spare key) in the car.
