

Memorial Trail Monument

The City Council would like ideas for the design of a monument to be erected along the Memorial Trail located on Sooner Road between SE 29th and SE 44th Street. A dedication ceremony is being planned for the 5th anniversary of the May 3, 1999 tornado next year.


The existing one-mile trail was funded by a donation from Grubbs Construction who conducted the cleanup after the tornado destroyed over 500 homes in the Del Aire Neighborhood. A requirement for the acceptance of the donation was for the City to erect a monument.

The monument area was incorporated into the trail in the original design donated by Don Vick of JGVE Engineering. The monument area is located off Sooner Road at Del Aire Drive where the trail loop will provide access to view the monument.

There have been many contributors to the recovery and rebuilding efforts. The Memorial will honor those who lost their lives and the many contributors.

The City is currently looking at a four-piece granite unit that includes (2) benches, a pedestal with a sculpture mounted on the pedestal base. The unit is Oklahoma red granite with a black granite base.

The broken rock being put back together and the black base may provide some symbolism of the event and the rebuilding and getting lives back together. Order time for this piece is three months.

FOG: That's Fats Oils and Grease.

Please note the inserts about "Fat-Free Sewers". A few tips for the season:

Don't put food juices and drippings down the drain. They don't go very far before the grease solidifies and begins to adhere to the wall of the sewer pipes, both yours and the City's.

Allow juices and drippings to cool and then put into the used plastic or glass bottle that can be resealed. Place the container in the trash.

If the plumbing in your home begins to run slow or backs up, call the City sewer line maintenance department before you call a private plumber. There is no charge for the City service but there will likely be a charge for a private plumber to check out the problem.

In Del City, the 24-hour a day sewer line maintenance number is 671-2878. After regular work hours the system pages out and on call operator; after you leave a message.

On behalf of the **Del City Public Works Department** we hope you and your family have a very happy and safe Holiday Season.

Helping to prevent sewer overflows and backups is easy.

Where does the grease come from?

A byproduct of cooking, grease comes from meat fats, lard, oil, shortening, butter, margarine, food scraps, baking goods, sauces, and dairy products. When washed down the sink, grease sticks to the insides of sewer pipes (both on your property and in the streets). Over time, it can build up and block the entire pipe. Caution: Home garbage disposals do

Caution: Home garbage disposals do not keep grease out of the plumbing system. Products, such as detergents, that claim to dissolve grease may pass it down the line and cause problems elsewhere.


The results can be:

- Raw sewage overflowing in your home or your neighbor's home;
- An expensive and unpleasant cleanup that often must be paid for by **you**, **the home or business owner**;
- Raw sewage overflowing into parks, yards, and streets;
- Potential contact with disease-causing organisms; and
- An increase in operation and maintenance costs for local sewer departments, which causes higher sewer bills for customers.

What you can do to help:

Help prevent sewer overflows by:

- Never pouring grease down sink drains or into toilets;
- Scraping grease and food scraps into a can or the trash for disposal (or recycling where available);
- Putting baskets/strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids, and emptying them into the trash; and
- Speaking with your friends and neighbors about how to keep grease out of sewers.



- Designed (sized and manufactured to handle the amount that is expected);
 - Installed (level, vented, etc.); andMaintained (cleaned and serviced on a frequent basis).

Solids should never be put into grease traps or interceptors. Routine, often daily, maintenance of grease traps and interceptors is necessary.
