Hello Friends and Neighbors,

I want to assume you have read the crime statistic for the month of September. They don't really look any better than the previous month, just moved around from Vandalism to Auto Burglary. I try to study and analyze the different types of crime by time of reporting, location etc. The only correlation I can bring together is they are within close proximity of the apartments or just quick shots off, the observed pedestrian cut through of the neighborhood from 29<sup>th</sup> street to 44<sup>th</sup> street and Sunnylane. I sometimes wonder what it will take to get you as neighbors involved in a concern for the area you live in. As I read the newspaper and listen to the local news, about the shooting and how it is believed to be gang related. Well I don't want to bust your bubble, but we have some gangs and "want-tobe's" residing within one (1) mile of us and there may be some living with us here. I have said this in hope, each of you can come to the realization that going in to our cozy home at the end of our work day and closing the door does not make us exempt from what is happening around our area. The only way to prevent crime in our area is to be proactive. What do I mean by proactive, be observant all the time of what is going on around you and report suspicious activity. One of the best ways to be observant takes a little involvement and coordinated training. That is one of the thing that a neighborhood watch works well in accomplishing. As neighbors volunteering our time and efforts together gets many things done. I know there are some of you thinking, same old story just being played to a different tune. All I am asking you to do is become involved in your neighborhood watch organization. No one said you had to be a patroller, there are so many things that need just a small amount of your time, but when it is left to just a few then it takes a lot of their time. If you don't know for sure if you are on the list, check in to it anyway as you can use this website to renew your registration before it expires or even flle a complaint. You will get an email for confirmation and will tell you when it expires.

### Andy Rooney's tips for telemarketers Three Little Words That Work!!

The three little words are: "Hold On, Please..."

Saying this, while putting down your phone and walking off (instead of hanging-up immediately) would make each telemarketing call so much more time-consuming that boiler room sales would grind to a halt. Then when you eventually hear the phone company's "beep-beep" tone, you know it's time to go back and hang up your handset, which has efficiently completed its task. These three little words will help eliminate telephone soliciting.

#### Do you ever get those annoying phone calls with no one on the other end?

This is a telemarketing technique where a machine makes phone calls and records the time of day when a person answers the phone. This technique is used to determine the best time of day for a "real" sales person to call back and get someone at home. What you can do after answering, if you notice there is no one there, is to immediately start hitting your **# button on the phone**, **6 or 7 times**, **as quickly as possible**. This confuses the machine that dialed the call and it kicks your number out of their system. Gosh, what a shame not to have your name in their system any longer !!!

#### Junk Mail Help:

When you get "ads" enclosed with your phone or utility bill, return these "ads" with your payment. Let the sending companies throw their own junk mail away. When you get those "pre-approved" letters in the mail for everything from credit cards to 2nd mortgages and similar type junk, do not throw away the return envelope. Most of these come with postage-paid return envelopes, right?

It costs them more than the regular 37 cents postage "IF" and when they receive them back. It costs them nothing if you throw them away! The postage was around 50 cents before! the last increase and it is according to the weight. In that case, why not get rid of some of your other junk mail and put it in these cool little, postage-paid return envelopes. **One of Andy Rooney's (60 minutes) ideas.** 

Send an ad for your local chimney cleaner to American Express. Send a pizza coupon to Citibank. If you didn't get anything else that day, then just send them their blank application back! If you want to remain anonymous, just make sure your name isn't on anything you send them. You can even send the envelope back empty if you want to just to keep them guessing! It still costs them 37 cents. The banks and credit card companies are currently getting a lot of their own junk back in the mail, but folks, we need to OVERWHELM them. Let's let them know what it's like to get lots of junk mail, and best of all they're paying for it...Twice! Let's help keep our postal service busy since they are saying that e-mail is cutting into their business profits, and that's why they need to increase postage costs again. You get the idea! If enough people follow these tips, it will work----
