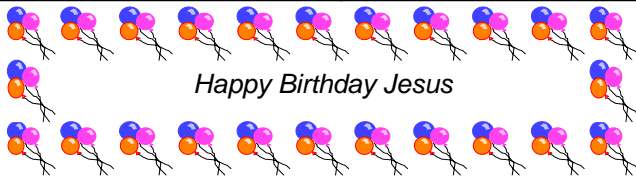
Our next General Meeting will be held December 11, 7:00 pm at the Calvary Christian Church, 3900 Epperly Dr. in the annex just north of the church.

### From the Desk of the Patrol Captain

Hello Friends and Neighbors,

I want to assume you have read the crime statistic for the month of October. They don't really look any better than the previous month, just moved around from one category to another. The prime item of interest is residential burglary. These are happening at all hours, more are happening in the day light hours when you are at work. The burglars take less than 15 minutes to kick in a door (most of the time one not easily seen from the street or from neighbors) go through the house and get the items they want and are ready to leave. Their helpers (look outs) and haulers then arrive and back up to the front door and load the electronic equipment and they are off. Yes this has been observed and chase has been given, some property has been recovered and one or two have been apprehended by the police. The real key is being vigil in knowing what is going around us, who is supposed to be here and who is not. This takes being involved (nosey) and report any suspicious or thought to be suspicious persons or activity to the police, giving good descriptions and vehicle tag numbers. Most of the homes broken into were cased before the day of the burglary. It is now the time of year that even more burglaries happen. We start buying Christmas presents and storing up for the great day of giving. Please be careful as you go shopping, think about where you are what is going on around you. I don't want to read about you in the newspaper for being a victim of a purse snatcher or robbed in you car because you did not lock your doors.

This is almost my last writing because I will be leaving this office at the end of December. Thanks for the support for the past three years. I do hope someone will come forward and fill the Patrol Captain office.
