Hello everyone,

We are now into April and that means warmer weather and spring. Spring means it's time for pruning and spring-cleaning. So, what are you going to do with all the stuff that you need to get rid of? Well we have the solution. It's **Free Dump** time again! The Del Aire Neighborhood Watch Association sponsored **Free Dump** is courtesy of the City of Del City and will be held April 20th, 21st & 22nd. The location, as usual, will be at Cheyenne Park, located on the south end of Vickie Drive. The hours will be 12:00 to 5:00 PM on Friday and 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday. And, as usual, the **Free Dump** is for <u>everyone</u> living in the DANWA area, whether you are a member or not.

We will be accepting almost anything that you need to get rid of. There will be area's to pile tree limbs and brush, wood, metal and dumpsters for trash. We will also be taking household batteries and automotive lead acid batteries for recycling. We will not be able to take any type of oil, chemicals, paints or tires. See the "Chemical Information" column under the Scout Corner on page 6 for that information.

If you are physically unable to haul your items or cannot get a means to haul them, let us know; we can help. The items will need to be easily accessible and ready to load. Call President James Standfill at 677-2333 or Patrol Captain Rex Warlick at 249-5927 to schedule a pickup during the **Free Dump**. So lets all gather up our items, help out neighbors with theirs, if needed and clean up our neighborhood for the summer.

The main thing to remember is that the dumping is **free**! It cost's you **nothing, nada, zip**, to get rid of all that stuff you keep thinking you need to get rid of. The City of Del City is being generous, by not charging, so take advantage of the offer!

Coming up in May is the Annual Shriners & Armed Forces Day Parade. Mark your calendar for the May 26th event and plan to attend and bring your flag. More information is included in this newsletter.





They take all types of chemicals; cleaning products, automotive products, lawn products, pesticides, workshop supplies and miscellaneous things like household batteries, fluorescent light bulbs and all flammable products. 
