From your President:

Hello everyone,

As you have probably noticed, warm weather has returned. This brings up several things I would like to discuss. First, everyone should be aware that the schools are out. That means children will be out playing in and around the streets at all hours of the day and evening. This means we need to be extra cautious when driving through our neighborhoods. Children tend to chase all kinds of things into the streets without looking first. More people will be out in the evening after dark, when it cools off, walking and riding bicycles. Not everyone wears the proper reflective gear that they should, making them hard to see until the last second. I highly recommend that anyone out in the streets after dark get a reflective belt, flashing arm band or belt clip. They are not very expensive and could save your life or that of a child.

Next I would like to bring up the subject of open garage doors. As we patrollers drive through the neighborhood, we notice many garage doors open and no one around outside; even at night. It is not uncommon to see 8 to 10 garage doors open even at 11:00 to 12:00 at night. This is an open invitation for thieves to take advantage of the situation. They can quickly remove things from your garage and you will probably not even notice they're gone until you go to use them. It also leaves you open to a home invasion as most people do not lock the door between the garage and the house. The watch recently received a report of a family, in our area, that had someone enter their home at night, while the family slept and stole 2 purses. The family was lucky, it could have been worse.

The last item applies year around. Do not leave a garage door opener in your vehicle, especially if the vehicle is parked outside at night. One of the things that thieves are doing is to break into a car and steal the garage door opener, among other things; and then in a couple of weeks they come back and use the opener to gain access to the home.

I hope everyone has a safe and fun summer.




May Meeting Highlights

If you need to get rid of chemicals and paints you can call 739-1352 (Midwest City Storm Water Quality) and get an appointment to drop those items off at the facility at 2425 South Douglas (just north of SE 29th and Douglas). This service is <u>FREE</u> to Del City residents. They take all types of chemicals; cleaning products, automotive products, lawn products, pesticides, workshop supplies and miscellaneous things like household batteries, fluorescent light bulbs and all flammable products. They also take all types of paints, thinners and stains.
