Hello everyone,

Please note: due to abuse buy some individuals from outside our area; we now require a recent water bill with an address from the DANWA area and a driver's license with a matching name; and please, no business trash. We will accept any water bill from the last several months. And as usual, you do not have to be a DANWA member to take advantage of the free dump but you must be within the DANWA area. So start gathering up the items you need to get rid of because it's free!

Have you sent in your membership renewal for 2008? If not, be aware that your name will have been removed from our patroller's lists by now. We started using the new lists the 20th of March. So please send in your renewal or new application as soon as possible so we can get you on our Patroller's lists.

Do you have any information on the boarded-up apartments on 29th street? Can the city condemn them so they can be torn down? They are really an eye sore for our city. Thanks, M. H.

City's answer...

Our City Manager was very quick to respond when I posed this the above.

Appreciate your request. Here is what I can tell you to date. The city building officials have condemned the structures for habitation and ordered them removed. i.e. torn down.

The property owner objected to our order and appealed that order to the Board of Adjustment in December. The Board of Adjustment rejected the appeal and confirmed the cities condemnation order in January. The property owner has filed an appeal to district court and requested a reversal of the board of adjustment order. We have not yet been given a court date to pursue the condemnation further.

I do know that once that order is upheld, if it is, we will have to take it back to the council for final action and public hearing on the actual raze and remove aspect.

There are several issues regarding this property besides the physical condition. For example, the structures flood when the creek gets up. The structures were built in a flood way which today we would not allow.

Second, the actual aspects of the physical condition relate to lack of long term proper maintenance and the structures due to water leaks, flooding, mold and electrical are no longer safe to live in.

The structures have been identified as potential threats to the Air Force APZ1 zone as high residential threats located in the end of the clear zone. Hope this helps, provided by Mark Edwards, City Manger, Del City.

Notice from the City of Del City regarding Parked Trucks

To: All Supervisory Personnel

March 7th, 2008

From: Chief Taylor

Date: March 7th, 2008

Re: Parked Trucks/ Private Property/ Residential

The city and Police Department continues to receive an increasing number of truck parking complaints from citizens. As we are all aware, enforcement of truck owners are over the legal weight limit while parked on residential streets. (Refer to City Code, under Ordinance, Sec. 11-151)

There continues to be a growing number of individuals who are parking their over weight limit trucks in their front yards after 5:00 PM in what appears to be a deliberate effort to avoid the code enforcement officers.

The following directive shall be placed into effect this date:

Upon personal observation, police personnel shall issue a citation (s) to the owner/resident of any over weight truck parked upon private property located within a residential district.

Citizens and city officials will, of course, continue to provide the department with information regarding persons who may be in violation of this city ordinance.

Pleased be advised that all of the truck parking permits that had previously been "grand fathered", have now expired. Any person that may bring up a discussion related to a truck parking permit would have no legal standing in this matter.

Be advised that City Ord. 11-151 is currently in the process of being updated to eliminate issues, which no longer have relevance to this ordinance.
