



From the Desk of the Patrol Captain

Hello Friends and Neighbors,

Hard to believe that another year has almost slipped by and we are back to Ghost and Goblin month again already. Our patrollers will be out again this Halloween to help ensure the safety of all those little monsters. We should have the glow bracelets available again also so be sure to watch for the patrollers that evening and get one or two for your special little ghoul!

Here are a few other tips to help keep your goblin safe:

- Help your child pick out or make a costume that will be safe. Make it fire proof, the eye holes should be large enough for good peripheral vision.
- If you set jack-o-lanterns on your porch with candles in them, make sure that they are far enough out of the way so that kids costumes won't accidentally be set on fire.
- Make sure that if your child is carrying a prop, such as a scythe, butcher knife or a pitchfork, that the tips are smooth and flexible enough to not cause injury if fallen on.
- Kids always want to help with the pumpkin carving. Small children shouldn't be allowed to use a sharp knife to cut the top or the face. There are many kits available that come with tiny saws that work better then knives and are safer, although you can be cut by them as well. It's best to let the kids clean out the pumpkin and draw a face on it, which you can carve for them.
- Treating your kids to a spooky Halloween dinner will make them less likely to eat the candy they collect before you have a chance to check it for them.
- Teaching your kids basic everyday safety such as not getting into cars or talking to strangers, watching both ways before crossing streets and crossing when the lights tell you to, will help make them safer when they are out Trick or Treating.

Auto Burglary Prevention

Crime is like a table with three legs - it takes all three legs to stand. If you take away even one leg, the table isn't supported. Desire, ability & opportunity must all exist to support crime. Even though we may not be able to stop someone's desire to commit a crime, we can take away their ability and/or their opportunity to commit the crime.

DESIRE + ABILITY + OPPORTUNITY = CRIME

Auto Burglary Prevention, like all crime prevention, is the act of taking away the criminals ability and/or opportunity to commit a crime. With a little time and diligence, you can make a difference in your vulnerability to Auto Burglary!

Curb Auto Burglary

The Tampa Police Department's "Move It or Lose It" Auto Burglary Prevention campaign is a way of reminding citizens how the simple act of placing valuables into the trunk of their car can significantly reduce the likelihood of being a victim of auto burglary.

Sometimes we have wrong impression of criminals. We put our valuables in the floorboard or seat and cover them. Actually this often has the opposite effect and broadcasts that there is something of value in the car.

You can <u>download our Move It or Lose It (942KB)</u> campaign hang-tag flyer to print and distribute at your business, church, organization, etc. The flyer is designed for letter size (8.5 x 11 inches) with three per sheet which can be cut apart.

Natural Surveillance

One of the techniques used in modern crime prevention is "natural surveillance." While this principle is usually applied to building and area design, you can use it to your advantage too. Park in an area where the likelihood is greatest that others will view it with the greatest frequency. Criminals do not like to commit their acts in plain view of many people, they like seclusion.

Prevention Tips

- Close your windows & lock you doors (the simplest & easiest prevention technique).
- Remove valuables or place them in the trunk of your automobile.
- Remove 'pull-out' style radio face plates (if equipped).
- Park in well lit areas when possible.
- Park where your car will be easily & frequently viewed (natural surveillance)
- Park in your garage if you have one.
- Use a car alarm, it will alert anyone nearby.

BY THE NUMBERS

30—The seconds it takes for a thief to break in your car and steal your valuables!

20—The seconds it takes to put our valuables into your trunk, out of sight!!
