Hello everyone,

Another year has gone and a new one started. I hope that the past year wasn't too bad on anyone. Hopefully things will start getting better if we all can hang on long enough. The crime rate has been going up everywhere, including our area. The reason is partly because of the Holidays and partly because of the economy. But criminals have all the excuse they need; they are lazy. It's easier for them to get their money by stealing for an hour a day than to work for a living like the rest of us. It then falls to us to make their job as hard as possible. It seems that most of the burglaries have been taking place during the hours of 9 AM to 3PM; when most people are at work or out doing other things and the children are in school. Those folks that are home during the day need to be aware of what is going on near their homes and report suspicious activity. Some things that can be done to help protect your home cost very little; such as hardening the door locks with longer screws and installing lock bars on patio doors. Some things cost more, such as installing alarm systems. We also have had cases of home invasions where individuals walked up to homes where people were unloading items and taking them into the house. They then went into the house and robbed the occupants. If you see strangers in your area when approaching your home, it may be best to go around the block and wait until they are gone before getting out of your car at home. The thing is; there are many ways to help protect yourself and your property. If you have any questions, send me an e-mail or give me a call.

On other things; the watch group just had our Officer Elections. And sad to say, no one was interested in filling any of the positions. The Vice presidents position is vacant and as of the 1st of January, the current Treasurer will be leaving for personal reasons and that position will be vacant. We really need people to attend meetings and become active in the Neighborhood Watch Group. This is YOUR neighborhood watch association, not mine or any one individual's. If people do not come out and support the organization, then it will slowly wither and die. The watch group was started in response to a very high crime rate in our area. The watch group has made a difference and I can assure you that if the watch group goes away, crime will go way up. The men and women that volunteer their time to patrol our area cannot be everywhere all the time. We know that we cannot stop all crime in our area. But the more vehicles that we can put on the streets to patrol, the better off everyone will be.

Picked up the following information from an email and it appears to be good advice:

- 1. Do not sign the back of your credit cards. Instead, put "PHOTO ID REQUIRED", or "CID" (see ID).
- 2. When you are writing checks to pay on your credit card accounts, DO NOT put the complete account number on the "For" line. Instead, just put the last four numbers. The credit card company knows the rest of the number and anyone who might be handling your check as tit passes through all the check processing channels won't have access to it.
- 3. Put your work phone number on your checks instead of your home phone. If you have a PO Box, use that instead of your home address. If you do not have a PO Box, use your work address. Never have your social security number printed on your checks. You can add it if it is necessary. But if you have it printed, anyone can get it.
- 4. Place the contents of your wallet on a photocopy machine. Do both sides of each license, credit card, etc. You will know what you have in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed on us in stealing a name, address, social security number, and credit cards.
- 5. We have been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately. But the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them
- 6. File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where your credit cards, etc., were stolen. This proves to credit providers you were diligent and this is a first step toward an investigation (if there ever is one).
- 7. Call the 3 national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and also call the social security fraud line number. The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit.

A little bit of U.S. Flag etiquette quoted from www.usflag.org

Flag Etiquette Standards of Respect



The Flag Code, which formalizes and unifies the traditional ways in which we give respect to the flag, also contains specific instructions on how the flag is not to be used. They are:

- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing.
- It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should not be used as a drapery, or for covering a speakers desk, draping a platform, or for any decoration in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halyard.
- The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have placed on it, or attached to it, any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind
- The flag should never be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.

When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object, it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously

The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.

When a flag is so worn it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.

Note: Most American Legion Posts regularly conduct a dignified flag burning ceremony, often on Flag Day, June 14th. Many Cub Scout Packs, Boy Scout Troops, and Girl Scout Troops retire flags regularly as well. Contact your local American Legion Hall or Scout Troop to inquire about the availability of this service. Editor note, the Boy Scout Troop we sponsor does this each year and is a ceremony everyone should experience at least once.

The remainder of Flag Etiquette is lengthy but is interesting and thoughtful reading. If you don't have computer capabilities to view this information, contact me and I will produce a copy for you to pick up.
