

Del City to flatten former city hall.....

The old city hall building on SE 29th will be torn down this fall to make room for a new police complex.

Midwest Wrecking Co. was selected to demolish the building late September or in October.

The new complex will house a jail, police offices and courtroom facilities.

City Manager Mark Edwards said the police department has outgrown the existing 7,000 square foot building at 2800 Epperly Drive. "It was built in 1948 and it's in poor condition" Mr. Edwards said. I'm pretty sure he meant the interior.

The new complex will be funded through a \$3 Million bond. The building will be named after William Haskell Keith, a Del City officer who died in a car crash during a pursuit in 1965.

City officials are considering renovating the existing police station into a senior citizens center but o plan has been set.

From the Desk of the Patrol Captain

Hello Friends and Neighbors,

Want to stay better informed about what is going on in our neighborhood? **Go to our website and sign up for DARTS!** You will get more specific and timely information on the good and bad things happening in our neighborhood and get the monthly newsletter electronically. You may be able to help stop the next thief or avoid being his or her next victim!

Tip #6—Find alternatives to normal deadbolts in doors that have windows (or windowed frames) Talk with a locksmith about what is available.

Reason: Most burglaries occur during the day when you are away at work. Unfortunately, many back doors are decorative and windowed. It is easy for a burglar to punch out a small window, reach in and unlock the door. Since they are off the street and out of view this is why most break-ins occur through the back and side doors.

A single-key deadbolt has a key on one side and a handle on the other. After punching out a window a burglar can reach in and, with ease, open the deadbolt then the doorknob - elapsed time five seconds. Placing a secondary lock (i.e., a floor lock) outside of the reach of the windows is recommended. If that is too much, a double-key deadbolt is recommended for non-primary access doors. This secures the door while you are not at home. If fire safety concerns you (and it should) at night put your keys in the deadbolt. This not only allows you immediate exit should a fire occur, but you will also always know where your keys are.

Article 1

DEL CITY DOG AND PUPPY STERILILZATION EVENT

Pet overpopulation resulted in the euthanasia of more than 16,000 adoptable animals in fiscal year 2008 at the Oklahoma City Animal Welfare Division (AWD) alone. And the direct cost to the City of Del City for utilizing AWD is more than \$200,000 per year.

In order to stop this senseless loss of lives, AWD with the endorsement of Del City have made the commitment to move toward a no-kill shelter by 2014. The first step is to educate the public on the necessity to sterilize their pets in order to reduce this unwanted population. In addition, AWD received a grant of \$10,000 from PetSmart Charities, Inc. to sterilize 570 dogs and puppies belonging to low-income owners who reside in Del City.

There is no limit on the number of dogs or puppies that can be altered per Del City household. The cost is \$17.50 for each. Puppies can be safely sterilized as early as 2 months and 2 pounds.

It is a well proven fact that sterilized dogs are healthier; roam less; fight less; and show less aggression. They also don't contribute to pet overpopulation problems, increased shelter and animal control costs, or euthanasia rates.

The success of the first pilot of its kind in the metro area could result in the expansion of this program to other local communities.

Article 2

In accordance with the Animal Welfare Division's efforts to increase the live exit rate for sheltered animals and to decrease the euthanasia of shelter pets, the Division applied for a grant from PetSmart Charities to sterilize dogs and puppies from Del City. The intent of this project is to decrease the number of unwanted dogs and puppies in Del City, thereby decreasing the number of intakes from that community. The funds are to be used to sterilize dogs and puppies belonging to low-income owners residing within the corporate limits of The City of Del City.

Animal Welfare applied for this grant because PetSmart Charities is currently interested in targeting very specific populations of animals for sterilization, instead of using a wider, "scattershot" approach to community sterilization efforts. They funded this project because it targets a group of animals (dogs) from a geographically well-defined area (Del City) within which the progress of such an undertaking can be easily tracked and quantified over time. Approximately 88% of the animals coming into the shelter from Del City are canines, and the number of dogs to be sterilized (571) represents about 12% of Del City's estimated dog population. PetSmart Charities is very interested in learning what effect sterilizing 12% of a canine population would have on shelter intake and service demand.

The sterilization of dogs and puppies owned by low-income residents of The City of Del City will be provided through one or more contracted vendors of low-cost sterilization services, with oversight and reporting managed by the Animal Welfare Division.
