Well, we had another close call on May 10th with the tornado outbreak. I mention this because DANWA started updating the storm shelter list we keep based on the information from the annual membership application. This list is passed on to the Del City Fire Department to be used in case of another direct hit like back in 1999. We are now adding anyone to the list that wants their storm cellar or safe room listed with the Fire Department. The list is not made public or given to anyone except the Fire Department. You do not have to be a DANWA member to get on the list. You do not even have to give your name. Just call or e-mail me with the address, type of shelter (cellar or safe room) and the location (front yard, back yard, garage, middle of house, etc.). If you want the GPS data taken, we can take care of that also but it is not required.

The 101 critical days of summer started at the end of May. This is the time between Memorial Day and Labor Day in which there is a spike in fatalities due to summer travel and recreation. So please be careful and stay safe this summer in whatever your summer time pursuits are.

We are reprinting this information just in case it has been misplaced—this is vital, especially since we have had the storms come up so quickly this year. It certainly seems different than in the past.

Storm safety tips:

Lightning Safety Tips:

- Avoid contact with corded phones
- Avoid contact with electrical equipment or cords. If you plan to unplug any electronic equipment, do so well before the storm arrives.
- Avoid contact with plumbing. Do not wash your hands., do not take a shower, do not wash dishes, and do not do laundry.
- Stay away from windows and doors, and stay off porches.
- Do not lie on concrete floors and do no lean against concrete walls.

Tornado Safety Tips:

- Decide in advance where you will take shelter. When a tornado approaches, go there immediately
- Keep trees and shrubbery trimmed. Cut weak branches and trees that could fall on your house.
- Become familiar with your community's severe weather warning system and make certain every adult and teenager in your family knows what to do when a tornado "watch' or "warning" sounds.
- Identify escape routes from your home and neighborhood and designate an emergency meeting place for your family to reunite if you become separated.
- Move anything in your yard that can become flying debris inside your house or garage before a storm strikes.
- Don't try to ride out a tornado in a manufactured home.

Know the signs of a tornado:

- Strong, persistent rotation in the cloud base
- Whirling dust or debris on the ground under a cloud base—tornadoes sometimes have no funnel.
- Hail or heavy rain followed by either dead calm or a fast, intense wind shift. Many tornadoes are wrapped in a
 heavy precipitation and can't be seen.
- Day or night—Loud, continuous roar or rumble, which doesn't fade in a few seconds like thunder.
- Night—Small, bright, blue-green to white flashes at ground level near a thunderstorm (as opposed to silvery lightning up in the clouds). These mean power lines are being snapped by very strong wind, maybe a tornado.

Put together an emergency kit that includes:

- A three-day supply of drinking water and food you don't have to refrigerate or cook;
- First aid supplies;
- A portable NOAA weather radio;
- A wrench and other basic tools;
- A flashlight;
- Work gloves;
- Emergency cooking equipment;
- Portable lanterns;
- Clothing; blankets; baby items;
- Prescription medications;
- Extra car and house keys;
- Credit cards and cash;
- Important documents, including insurance policies.

If you have a storm cellar and don't think you are on the DANWA list of safe rooms, storm cellars. Contact a DANWA officer and we will bring the GPS by to document the location and apply it to our list. This will help the fire and police departments with locating areas in case another tornado wipes homes out as it did in 1999.
