Hello everyone,

The crime statistics for the month of November (we are always a month behind due to the printing schedule) are looking very good. I hope they hold out through the month of December. Some people ask how I come to this conclusion; after all there were 3 burglaries, 6 larcenies (thefts) and 2 robberies. If you look at the crime statistics (located elsewhere in this newsletter) you will see, for example, on the burglaries, stats for last month, same month last year and for the whole city. I also get the statistics for the other areas of Del City. Staying with the burglaries, I know that the square mile west of us (Hartsdel) had 9 and the square mile north of us (Old Town) had 7. So based on all those numbers (6 in October, 6 last November, 28 city wide, 9 in Hartsdel and 7 in Old Town) our 3 (2 without the apartments) is looking good. I also look at where this occurred; residence, apartment or business, because we do not patrol apartments or all businesses. For an example of how this effects the numbers, look at larcenies (thefts). There were 6 larcenies in November but only 1 was at a residence; the other 5 were out of our normal operation area. I hope that now you have some understanding of how we determine how we are doing.

The Officer elections were held in December and new Secretary was elected to replace outgoing Secretary Carol Standfill. Our new Secretary, effective at the January meeting will be Pat Satterwhite. We are glad to have her as a member of our Executive team. Also, all the remaining Officers were reelected to their current positions as there were no other members willing to fill those positions.

And lastly on a sad note, one of our long term Base Operators, #40 passed away recently. Virginia succumbed to illness recently. Our sympathy goes out to her Family. She will be missed.

PUT YOUR CAR KEYS BESIDE YOUR BED AT NIGHT

Put your car keys beside your bed at night. If you hear a noise outside your home or maybe someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies.

This tip came from another neighborhood watch coordinator. Next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this: It's a security alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation. Test it. It will go off from most everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until your alarm resets, the battery runs down, or until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain. It works if you park in your driveway or garage. If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your house, odds are the would be burglar or rapist won't stick around... After a few seconds all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there and sure enough the criminal won't want that; and remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there This is something that should really be shared with everyone. Maybe it could save a life or a sexual abuse crime.

This idea would also be useful for any emergency, such as a heart attack, where you can't reach a phone. The suggestion would be to carry your car keys with you in case you fall outside and you can't be heard. You can activate the car alarm and then someone know there's a problem and hopefully come running or looking for you.
