I would like to remind everyone that it is Membership renewal time again. Another Tidbit: When you go to buy bread in the grocery store, have you ever wondered which is freshest, so you "squeeze" for freshness or softness? Did you know that bread is delivered fresh to the stores five days a week? Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Each day has a different color twist tie. They are: Monday = Blue, Tuesday = Green, Thursday = Red, Friday = White and Saturday = Yellow. So if today was Thursday, you would want red twist tie; not white which is Fridays (almost a week old)! The colors go alphabetically by color Blue—Green—Red—White—Yellow, Monday Through Saturday. Very easy to remember. I thought this was interesting so I looked in the grocery store and the bread wrappers DO have different twist ties. Even the ones with the plastic clips have different colors. #### A reminder of what Del Aire Neighborhood Watch Association volunteer activities are.

In many of our past newsletters we have not only explained the duties of our DANWA officers but have elaborated on different reasons why DANWA is not able to physically perform certain activities. **DANWA is an extension of you, our neighbor**. We are additional eyes and ears for the police, the same as you are, DANWA member or not.

Your neighborhood watch cannot perform ANY duties of the City of Del City or the Del City Police Department. Your neighborhood watch is just that, an association of people <u>volunteering</u> their time to help watch our community. <u>NOBODY GETS PAID</u> to do anything. The patrollers provide their own vehicles, gas, time to patrol within our neighborhood. Your neighborhood watch members and patrollers have volunteered to help cut fallen trees after an ice storm by using their **personal equipment**, i.e. chain saw, axe, hatchet. Nobody is reimbursed for their time, gas, or equipment. There might even be one or two of our neighbors who have the equipment to remove snow with snow blowers or tractors. DANWA does not have that kind of equipment and there is no way they could afford it. I'm not real sure if there are members who have equipment to remove snow or ice from their own driveway let alone others driveways or sidewalks.

The City of Del City, on the other hand, does have tractors, hired personnel, and predetermined routes to clear snow, etc.

#### Community Service is our goal
