I hope everyone is managing to survive this unusually hot summer that we are having. Again, I would like to remind everyone to check in on friends or relatives, especially the elderly, which may not have air-conditioning. No one should have to suffer or maybe lose their life due to this heat.

The date has been set for the Del City Night Out. The event will be held at Eagle Lake on October 1st so please mark your calendar and plan to attend. Some other items that might be of interest; the new Welcome Center (on the corner by Wal-Mart) should have been completed by now. The refurbished Community Center should be complete by the first week of September. And lastly, the new Police Department building is on schedule for a fall move in.

At the July Membership meeting, we had a representative for the Mid-Del School Superintendent to talk about and answer questions about the September 13th school bond vote. The crime stats for the month of June were not too bad. There were 3 (residential) auto burglaries, 1 residential burglary and 3 (residential) larcenies. All but two of these crimes took place within 2 blocks of a major street (again). If you live within 2 blocks of one of our major streets, or anywhere for that matter, then I highly recommend that you take every step possible to keep from becoming a victim. These people obviously are staying close to the main streets so they have a better chance of getting out the neighborhood and getting away if seen. Don't leave lawn equipment, bicycles, etc. out in the yard; lock your vehicle and do not leave anything of value in it and keep your garage door closed when not in it or out front. These are just some quick and easy things that will help you keep from becoming a victim. Be Safe.

Sec. 13-13. Loud noise, music, words.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to disturb the peace and quietude of any part of the city by operating, having operated or permitting to be operated any contrivance, whether electric or not, with or without a loud-speaker, in such a manner as to emit loud music, noise or words. This section shall not prohibit religious bodies from playing chimes, bells, carillons or other religious music.

(b) It shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section if the sound can be heard outside the limits described below:

(1) Playing or operating or permitting the playing, use or operation of any radio, musical instrument, phonograph or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing sound if such sound is for the purpose of entertainment or is used for that purpose and can be heard from the distance of fifty (50) feet or if the source of such sound is located upon any public right-of-way; or

(2) If said source is located upon any public right-of-way and can be heard inside a structure or in a motor vehicle other than the source of said noise, and if in the receiving motor vehicle all doors and windows are closed.

(c) The City Council is hereby authorized to suspend enforcement of this section in conjunction with a special event which has been approved by the City Council or Del City Municipal Services Authority. Said suspension of enforcement shall specify the location and time during which enforcement of this section is to be suspended.

(Code 1973, § 18-13; Ord. No. 936, § 1, 5-20-91; Ord. No. 1185, § 1, 6-4-01)

State law references: Noise control, cooperation with state, O.S. § 1-1514.

Sec. 13-33. Disturbing the peace.

No person shall disturb the peace of another by:

(1) Violent, obstreperous, or improper conduct or carriage which in its common acceptance is calculated, or where the natural consequence is to cause an assault, battery or other breach of the peace;

(2) Unseemly, obscene, offensive, insulting or abusive language which in its common acceptance is calculated, or where the natural consequence is, to cause an assault, battery or other breach of the peace;

(3) Playing or creating loud or unusual sounds;

(4) Circulating literature which casts ridicule upon any deity or religion, which in its common acceptance is calculated to cause an assault, battery or other breach of the peace;

(5) Displaying any sign, emblem, badge, flag or other device, which in its common acceptance is calculated, or where the natural consequence is, to cause an assault, battery or other breach of the peace;

(6) Any person convicted of violating this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and costs, or by imprisonment for not more than sixty (60) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

My name is Jessica Woodie and I am a responsible High school student, but that means it would be best to call after 3:30 on the weekdays!

A concerned reader writes about noise ordinance and barking dogs. "Our problem is two large dogs next door to us that bark off and on 24 hours a day, mostly at night and mostly up between the easement between the two house (ours and our neighbors) which puts barking dogs within 5 feet of our bedroom window."

Also there is another concern about dogs running loose or getting out of their fenced yard and barking or running loose.

Regarding incessant barking—The animal control officer commented to the concerned reader that the dog(s) may be out (of the house) from 6:30 am to 9:00 pm and then back in the house". If they are not barkers, they can obviously remain outside. If a complaint is filed, the animal control officer can and will talk to the owner of the dog(s). After that, the owner can be given a citation.

Regarding pets (dogs, cats, etc.) running loose and not on a leash—IF they go outside the owners fences, i.e. in the front yard or even walking—they MUST BE ON A LEASH. Cats are no exception, they can't run loose. **If you have any questions regarding the comments in this article, please call Del City Animal Control 677-2443.**

Hello DANWA,

Sorry about the lack of an input last month. Time just shot by. Well we cooked burgers and dogs for the boat races last month. Had a lot of people come watch the races and ate plenty of burgers doing it. Cold drinks really sold well. It was 102° on both days and windy enough for our 10' x 10' canopy ripped from side to side. That made #2 gone.



The following Thursday we set off for our 4 day trip to Ft. Sill for fun in the sun and water. We chose the end of June so it would not be too hot, before the hot season. During our arrival we could see smoke rising over the hills. "Hey, ain't that where we are camping?" Guess what, you're right. We got to the camp site, LETRA, and set up camp as we looked to the east, about a mile, at the smoke blowing north. No problem. As long as the wind direction does not change we are fine. Swam at the beach, did some canoeing right from the camp site, did some GPS Geo-caching and watched the smoke. At night you can see how the main fire area slowly moved north. Every time it hit a pine tree a huge glow would light up the sky. Then the electricity went out.

Next morning we found out we had no bathrooms which the pumps ran on electricity, the beach was closed, and it was getting hot. So we went to Mt Scott but because highway 49 was closed, due to fire we had to drive 35 miles around Lawton to reach Mt. Scott which was only 3 miles away from the camp site. We could have thrown a rock to our camp site from the top of Mt. Scott we were so close. Hoping 49 would be open by then so we did not have to drive all the way back.....nope. Finally, we got back to camp. That's when we sized up the status. No electricity, no beach, 102 degrees and no bathrooms except for a port-a-potty ½ mile away. So we decide to get outta there. So when we were almost packed the base police came around screaming for all to evacuate because the wind shifted. Threw the rest of the stuff on the trailer and in the truck and hit the road. Naturally the short road was now closed so we had to head west on the back road of Ft. Sill. Did you know how big Ft. Sill is? **BIG.** Finally found a gate 35 minutes later on the southwest side of, yes you guessed it, Lawton. Drove back east then north around Lawton towards home.
