



STORM WATER POLLUTION PREVENTION REMINDERS

During the summer months there are some easy ways to reduce the amount of pollutants that enter our streams and creeks through storm water runoff.

Closely follow the instructions on any chemicals that are used on lawns. If you are instructed to water the lawn within a certain period of time, do that, rather than allowing rain to wash the chemicals in to storm drains.

Grass clippings should not be allowed to go down the storm drain. Grass clippings, leaves or other organic items can never be put directly in creeks or drainage channels.

Wash your car on the yard the dirt and soapy water will be soaked into the ground and not go into the storm drain. An even better method is to use a car wash.

Recycle used oil and anti-freeze at Public Works – 671-2874 between 8:00—3:30 weekdays. If you have household hazardous waste, call 739-1352 and make an appointment to drop it off.

If you notice anyone dumping anything into the storm water system to include creek areas, contact the Code Enforcement Hotline 670-7379 or Public Works at 671-2874

Our thoughts and prayers go out to all the tornado victims of the latest tornados and flooded areas from our recent rains.

Remember the kids are out of school now, so watch for them in on and around the streets.

A reminder that DANWA has the capability to locate your storm shelter by using the Global Positioning System (GPS) and will pass the information along to the fire department. In the case of a tornado leveling things or covering a shelter with debris, the GPS will aid fire fighters the coordinates for location. Questions, call Joe 672-0409, Ron 677-7923 or James 677-2333.

Try WD-40

It protects silver from tarnishing, removes road tar and grime from cars, cleans and lubricates guitar strings, keeps flies off cows, restores and cleans chalkboards. removes lipstick stains, loosens stubborn zippers, untangles jewelry chains, removes stains from stainless steel sinks, remove dirt and grime from the barbeque grill. removes tomato stains from clothing, keeps glass shower doors free of water spots, keeps scissors working smoothly, removes black scuff marks from the kitchen floor, lubricates gear shift on lawn mowers. The basic ingredient is FISH OIL.

USE THE "CLEAR" BUTTON

Using the "clear" button that is located on the buttons on the gas pump usually in the lower left hand side. People are getting really desperate due to the constantly rising gas prices. A friend just told me about something that happened to one of his coworkers. She used her credit/debit card to purchase gas at the pump (like most of us do). She received her receipt like normal how-ever, when she checked her statement, there were two (2) \$50.00 charges added in addition to her purchase. Upon investigation, she found out that because she did not press the "clear" button on the pump, the employee inside the store was able to use her card to purchase his/her own gas! To keep this from happening, after you get your receipt, you must press the "CLEAR" button or your information will be stored until the next customer inserts their card.

(DANWA has not verified this information but it doesn't hurt to think about this on any machine that uses a credit card)
