Crime Stats were presented

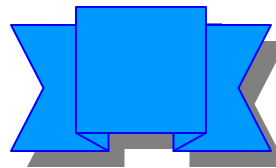
Free t-shirts are still available.

**This information for Seniors.**

Millions of Americans have registered their phones at the National Do Not Call Registry (donotcall.gov). Still yet they continue to receive unwanted calls from robocallers. Why? Because most robocalls are scams run by con artists who are only trying to trick you out of your money, and they simply ignore the law.

A few months ago, the Federal Communications Commission passed a rule giving telecommunications companies more leeway to block robocalls. Before its ruling, the FCC required phone companies to complete all calls, much in the same way the postal service is required to deliver all your mail, even the junk. So, look for your phone service provided to start offering call-blocking tools in the future.

In the meantime, here are some ways to reduce those unwanted calls. Set up "anonymous call rejection" option: This is a free landline-calling feature available from most telephone companies. It lets you screen out calls from callers who have blocked their caller ID information—a favorite tactic of telemarketers. To set it up, you usually have to dial *77 from your landline, though different phone services may have different procedures to set it up. Call your telephone service provider to find out if it offers this

feature, and if so, what you need to do to enable it (some companies do charge for the feature).

Buy a robocall-blocking device: If you don't mind spending a little money, purchase a call-blocking device like Sentry 2 (\$59) or Digitone Call Blocker Plus (\$100), sold at Amazon.com. These small devices, which plug into your phone line, allow you to blacklist numbers you no longer wish to receive and set up a whitelist, or manually program the phone to recognize and accept a certain number of safe numbers. Both devices are very effective.

Don't pick up: If you have a caller ID, another tip is to simply not answer the phone unless you recognize the number. But if you do answer and it's a robocall, you should just hang up the phone. Don't press 1 to speak to a live operator and don't press any other number to complain about the call or get your number off the list. If you respond by pressing any number, you're signaling that the auto dialer has reached a live number. That will probably lead to more robocalls.

Get a cell phone app: to help with robo telemarketing calls and robo span texts to your cell phone, get a call-screening app like Truecaller (truecaller.com) or PrivacyStar

(privacystar.com) that screens and blocks them.

It's also important that you report illegal robocalls to the Federal Trade Commission at : www.consumercomplaints.fcc.gov or 888-225-5322, and sign the Consumer Union petition at www.EndRobocalls.org to pressure phone companies to start offering free call-blocking technology.

Editor Note: Panasonic sells a phone system that allows (at least mine does) blocking of 250 numbers. So far it has worked very well. It still allows for one ring but when the system recognizes it is a blocked call, it stops further rings and hangs up.

A couple KEY reminders: if you have caller ID and don't recognize the number, let it ring (sometimes annoying) but effective since the robo machine doesn't record any kind of contact on your end of the line. Same thing if you have an answering machine but the down side is the robo detected someone picking up the receiver. My theory is if the person calling wants to leave me a message to call them back or if a friend calls—LEAVE A MESSAGE so I will know it needs returned.
