

Do you know what your \$12 a year DANWA membership (\$1.00 a month) actually does for you? It helps the patrollers notify, locate, contact, and watch for:

possibly seeing someone in a back yard or elsewhere they aren't supposed to be

maybe catch water running our of the house or garage due to a broken pipe

possibly spot a strange light (say a flashlight ) moving around within a house when nobody is supposed to be there; for instance the owner of the residence is gone on vacation or the house is VACANT

possibly an open garage door, it's dark around the residence, and nobody answers that home phone, nobody answers their emergency phone number – **DANWA calls** the police

maybe the alarm is sounding and DANWA assists by notifying the police and continues to watch the house while waiting for the police to arrive and assists the police with an emergency number to call

possibly a dome light remains illuminated in your vehicle and you aren't aware of it. Your car door is open and everything else is dark – no one around elderly might live alone and newspapers or mail start piling up – need to contact someone to see if the occupant of the resident is okay or needs attention let's say you go on vacation – DANWA patrollers make extra attempts and safety measures to watch the house there might be a lost or stray animal – DANWA can help watch for them

many times a child or elderly person gets lost - DANWA helps watch for them, no matter what neighborhood they are in

In all the actual cases above, DANWA made and will still make an attempt to contact the numbers or emergency contacts you provide when you become a member.

To the non-members, any of the scenarios above could happen to you as well – who would we call? Being a non-member, we have no information, your membership might be more important to you than you realize.



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#### **DEL AIRE DEFENDER**

#### Winter terms to know:

**Freezing Rain**—Rain that freezes on contact with roads, trees, sidewalks, etc.

**Sleet**—Rain that freezes before hitting the ground.

Winter storm watch—A winter storm is possible in the area.

**Blizzard warning**—Winds or gusts 35 mph or greater, along with snow are expected to last 3 hours or more.

**Winter storm warning—**A winter storm is occurring or will begin soon.

**Frost/freeze warning—**Temperatures are expected to drop below freezing.

#### **During and after a Winter Storm**

- Conserve heating fuel by shutting off unused rooms.
- Wear several layers of clothing and hat outdoors. Cover you mouth with a scarf to protect your lungs.
- Don't overexert yourself while shoveling snow
- Watch for signs of frostbite: loss of feeling along with paleness in tip of nose, fingers, toes and ear lobes.
- Beware of hypothermia. Signs include uncontrollable shivering, slurred speech, drowsiness, memory loss and disorientation.
- Avoid driving at night or alone. Notify others of your schedule and route.

#### If Your Vehicle Is Stranded in a Blizzard

- Pull off the road and turn on your hazard lights.
- Do not start walking unless you can see a building where you can take shelter.
- If no buildings are in sight, stay in your vehicle where rescuers are more likely to find you.
- Warp yourself in blankets or use seat covers, floor mats and maps.
- Run the engine for 10 minutes each hour to keep warm.
   Open a window slightly for ventilation.
- Balance use of the heater and lights to conserve the battery.
- If stuck in a remote location spell out "HELP" or "SOS" with rocks or branches.

#### Winterize Your Vehicle

- Check the wipers, battery, heater, defroster, ignition system, lights, oil, and tire pressure.
- Consider purchasing snow tires or chains.
- Pack a winter emergency kit with a window scraper, blankets, battery-powered radio, flashlight, water, snack food, tow chain or rope, shovel and flares.

Check your spigots and make sure your hoses are not connected—could cause the pipes to freeze and burst.

For those who have outside animals, continue to check their water and if shelter is available.
