WD-40 Uses:

- **1.** Protects silver from tarnishing.
- 2. Removes road tar and grime from cars.
- **3.** Cleans and lubricates guitar strings.
- **4.** Gives floor that 'just-waxed' sheen without making them slippery.
- 5. Keeps the flies off of Cows, Horses, and other Farm Critters, as well. (Ya gotta love this one!!!)
- **6.** Restores and cleans chalkboards.
- 7. Removes lipstick stains.

8. Loosens stubborn zippers.

- 9. Untangles jewelry chains.11. Removes dirt and grime from the barbecue grill.
- 10. Removes stains from stainless steel sinks.
- 12. Keeps ceramic/terracotta garden pots from oxidizing.13. Removes tomato stains from clothing.14. Keeps glass shower doors free of water spots.
- 13. Removes tomato stains from clothing.14. Keeps g15. Camouflages scratches in ceramic and marble floors.
- **16.** Keeps scissors working smoothly.
- 17. Lubricates noisy door hinges on both home and vehicles doors.
- **18.** It removes that nasty tar and scuff marks from the kitchen flooring. It doesn't seem to harm the finish and you won't have to scrub nearly as hard to get them off. Just remember to open some windows if you have a lot of marks.
- 19. Remove those nasty bug guts that will eat away the finish on your car if not removed quickly!
- 20. Gives a children's playground gym slide a shine for a super fast slide.
- 21. Lubricates gearshift and mower deck lever for ease of handling on riding mowers.
- 22. Rids kids rocking chair and swings of squeaky noises.

- **34.** Keeps pigeons off the balcony (they hate the smell).
- **35.** Removes all traces of duct tape.
- **36.** Folks even spray it on their arms, hands, and knees to relieve arthritis pain.
- **37.** Florida 's favorite use is: 'cleans and removes love bugs from grills and bumpers.
- **38.** The favorite use in the state of New York, it protects the Statue of Liberty from the elements.
- **39.** WD-40 attracts fish. Spray a little on live bait or lures and you will be catching the big one in no time.
