Winter terms to know:

Freezing Rain—Rain that freezes on contact with roads, trees, sidewalks, etc.

Sleet-Rain that freezes before hitting the ground.

Winter storm watch— a winter storm is possible in the area. Blizzard warning- winds or gusts 35 mph or greater, along with snow are expected to last 3 hours or more.

Winter storm warning—a winter storm is occurring or will begin

Frost/freeze warning- temperatures are expected to drop below freezing.

If your vehicle is stranded in a blizzard:

- Pull off the road and turn on your hazard lights.
- Do not start walking unless you can see a building where you can take shelter...
- If no buildings are in sight, stay in your vehicle where rescu-

ers are more likely to find you.

- Wrap yourself in blankets or use seat covers, floor mats and maps.
- Run the engine for 10 minutes each hour to keep warm. Open a window slightly for ventilation
- Balance use of the heater and lights to conserve the battery
- If stuckk in a remote location spell out 'HELP" or "SOS" wih rocks or branches.

Winterize your vehicle:

- Check the wipers, battery, heater, defroster, ignition system, lights, oil, and tire pressure.
- Consider purchasing snow tires or chains.
- Pack a winter emergency kit with a window scraper, blankets, battery-operated radio, flashlight, water, snack food, tow chain or rope, shovel and flares.
