Beginning June 2023 the City of Del City began replacing the old water meters with new digital ones. Replacement will be done on a billing cycle set up whereby certain sections will receive the new meters at different times. It I'm not mistaken you should receive a notice with your water bill explaining about the new meters. One item of caution to be noted......be cautious when mowing or walking around your yard, especially at the meter area. I understand part of the new system (transmitter) will be above ground, i.e. on the top of your water meter area. They aren't cheap and if you break it, you pay for it. Again, there should be an extra piece of literature in your upcoming bill explaining the new meters.

Here are the tips the FBI recommends to protect yourself:

- Once you scan a QR code, check the URL to make sure it is the intended site and looks authentic. A malicious domain name
 may be similar to the intended URL but with typos or a misplaced letter.
- Practice caution when entering login, personal, or financial information from a site navigated to from a QR code.
- If scanning a physical QR code, ensure the code has not been tampered with, such as with a sticker placed on top of the original code.
- Do not download an app from a QR code. Use your phone's app store for a safer download.
- If you receive an email stating a payment failed from a company you recently made a purchase with and the company states you
 can only complete the payment through a QR code, call the company to verify. Locate the company's phone number through a
 trusted site rather than a number provided in the email.
- Do not download a QR code scanner app. This increases your risk of downloading malware onto your device. Most phones have a built-in scanner through the camera app.
- If you receive a QR code that you believe to be from someone you know, reach out to them through a known number or address to verify that the code is from them.
- Avoid making payments through a site navigated to from a QR code. Instead, manually enter a known and trusted URL to complete the payment.
