I also want to thank Mayor Greg Childers for dropping by the July DANWA General meeting. He alluded to several projects Del City is working on; curbs, sidewalks, new parks, new business, and the upcoming G.O. Bond vote on August 25th.

On page four of the July 2026 Del Aire Defender, Joe did a great job of outlining the bulk trash and abatement issues in the City. I try to attend the City Council meetings and am always amazed at how many properties and how much money is on the abatement agenda. I always look through the addresses to see how many are in our area, and have been glad to see how few were. But not so fast! I've seen plenty of violations in Del Aire, tall grass/weeds, derelict vehicles, junk all over the yard. Yes, I understand that it can take 3, 4 or even 6 months for a property to move through the abatement process, but it is the first step that is so crucial. Before code enforcement can initiate the process, a citizen must (anonymously) call in on the property. Del City Code Enforcement 405 677 -5741 ext. 3 cityofdelcity.org

Yes, that means we have to help clean up our neighbor's mess. But it's our neighborhood too, even if that neighbor lives 5 blocks or a mile away. If you are apprehensive about calling the City, call or email me, leave the address and problem, and I'll notify the City, (It's probably already on my list). As has been suggested, if the neighbor is elderly or has been having some medical issues, be a good neighbor, check on them and see if you can be of some assistance.

With regards to downed tree limbs from severe weather, the City will pick those up for FREE, the same rules apply as with bulk trash.

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**I'm going to run this one more time.....** There seems to be a lot of confusion with residents not knowing when Bulk Trash Pickup is and how it works.

**Bulk trash service is provided once a month for each area of the city.** To maintain safe, clean neighborhoods, residents **MUST** follow rules for placing bulk trash at the curb.

**Do not set bulk trash out early.** Placing bulk items at the curb too early can create safety hazards, block sidewalks, attract illegal dumping and hurt the appearance of our community.

Only place bulk trash on the curb **on your assigned week.** For Ward 1 it is first full week of the month, for Ward 3 it is the third full week of the month.

**Be advised:** Bulk trash placed at the curb outside of your scheduled week is a **VIOLATION OF CITY CODE.** Residents who do so may be subject to **CITATIONS AND FINES IN ADDITION TO POSSIBLE REMOVAL COSTS.**

**KEEP PILES NEAT AND CLEAR** of fire hydrants, mailboxes, utility meters, power lines, and trees.

Loose items **MUST** be bagged or boxed for removal.

Piles larger than 4 cubic yards but less than 8 cubic yards will result in a **FEE** added to the utility account, 9 cubic yards or more will **NOT** be picked up.

**The following explanation of Ward 1 and Ward 3 is for the Del Aire  
Neighborhood Watch Area ONLY**

For Ward 1 from Sooner to Sunnyslane

South side of Del View Drive to Princess Lane  
South side of Princess Lane to Vickie  
East side of Vickie to S.E. 41<sup>st</sup> Street  
South side of S.E. 41<sup>st</sup> Street to Epperly Drive  
West side of Epperly Drive to S.E. 38<sup>th</sup> Street  
South side of S.E. 38<sup>th</sup> Street to Sunnyslane Road.

For Ward 3, very simply the opposite sides of the streets

North side of Del View Drive to Princess Lane  
North side of Princess Lane to Vickie  
West side of Vickie to S.E. 41<sup>st</sup> Street  
North side of S.E. 41<sup>st</sup> Street to Epperly Drive  
East side of Epperly Drive to S.E. 38<sup>th</sup> Street  
North side of S.E. 38<sup>th</sup> Street to Sunnyslane Road.

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For the sake of clarification, neighborhood watches are designed to be used as neighbors helping neighbors, neighbors looking out for neighbors.

That being said, it is your responsibility to report situations that aren't normal, i.e. suspicious activity, mass of children or adults roaming the streets up to no good, derelict vehicles, grass/weeds being very high or out of code, wrecked cars just sitting in driveways, things that make your neighborhood look bad or unkept, thieves like those kinds of conditions, you name it, **just try to keep our city looking good, be a good neighbor!!!**

**RESIDENTIAL SANITATION PICKUP**

To ensure reliable and efficient sanitation for all residents, please take note of the following rules for household trash collection:

**CONTAINER REQUIREMENTS**

All household garbage must be placed in City-approved polykarts with lids securely closed. Loose bags, boxes, or scattered debris will not be collected.

**PLACEMENT AND REMOVAL TIMES**

Polykarts are to be **placed at the curb** no earlier than 6:00 PM the evening before your scheduled pickup day. **Polykarts must be removed from the curb no later than 8:00 AM the following day after collection.**

**PROHIBITED ITEMS**

Household garbage ONLY. No construction debris, tires, hazardous waste, paint, electronics, or bulk items. Bulk trash and yard waste are collected separately under specific programs.

**For years I have reminded in the newsletter to place your carts at least 4 feet apart and at least 3 feet away from mailboxes, fire hydrants, utility poles, utility meters and parked cars!!! What is it going to take for you to read and heed? The Waste Management truck's pick up arms are skinny but it spreads to about 4 feet before it can grasp the polycart. Place the polykart on the curb (in your yard) NOT IN THE STREET!!! When in the street, cars have to drive around them.**

**AGAIN, PLACEMENT AT THE CURB** with the lid opening facing the street **NOT IN THE STREET.**

**ENFORCEMENT**

Failure to follow these rules may result in missed collection. You may request a return pickup by calling (405)671-2873. A fee for each polykart will be added to the utility bill.

By following these guidelines, you help keep our sanitation system safe, efficient, and dependable for everyone in the community.
