CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Regular city council meetings take place every first and third Monday at City Hall. The last regular meeting was held at 3701 SE 15th, on July 20, 2009.

- Council approved minutes, of special meeting of the Council of July 15, 2009.
- Council approved budget amendment for FY 2008-2009.
- Budget amendment for FY 2009-2010 was also approved.
- Council granted purchase order for A-Deal Services in the amount of \$10,000.00 for Code Enforcement abatements of public nuisances.
- Council decided purchase order in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00 to engage the services of McAfee, Taft law firm.
- Council agreed holding an Open House for citizens to visit and tour the new City Hall Building at 3701 SE 15th Street between the hours of 7a.m.— 7 p.m. on Wednesday, July 29, 2009.
- Council approved Mutual Cooperation Agreement between the Board of County Commissioners of Oklahoma County and the City, authorizing mutual cooperation for maintenance, construction and repair of certain streets within the City, and the installation of tin horns within the limits of the City.
- Council approved establishing the rate for Nine-One-One Emergency Telephone Service fee for calendar year 2010 at 3% of the recurring charges as designated by the tariff.
- Council approved the additional purchase of furniture needed for Del City Hall for an amount not to exceed \$13,489.00.
- Council declared building located at 4517 SE 29th Street as surplus and authorized to secure bids/quotes for demolition and removal of said City owned property.
- Council approved assessment cost to property owners for cleanup of properties located at the following address:
 - 3912 SE 10th Place in the amount of \$536.31 - Owner - Ray K Moss, Oklahoma City, OK.
 - 4008 Del Road in the amount of \$1,280.57 - Owner - Silvia Lawson, Del City, OK.
 - 4109 SE 9th in the amount of \$544.54 - Owner - Clyde D Rogers, Harrah, Oklahoma.
- Council extended award of Invitation - CDBG 2008 Sewer Line Replacement for thirty days to allow additional time to prepare documents needed, including FY 2007-2008 audit.

POLICE REPORT

Police Officers went to the OCPD shooting range this week for bi-annual firearms qualification, the training is required to maintain yearly police certification. Patrol and Plain clothes officers completed several different courses for proficiency in shooting a rifle, pistol and shotgun. SWAT Officers also spent a day at the range practicing tactical shooting. The Police Department will host a Citizens Police Academy in August. The CPA will be open to Del City Residents who will receive an extensive curriculum that educates them as to all aspects of what we do as police officers. They will learn how crimes are reported and investigated also residents interested in attending should pick up an application from the Chief's Secretary as soon as possible. The dates are August 11th thru September 3rd.

Firehouse Happenings Summer Safety Day a Huge Success

Eagle Harbor Aquatic Center was the setting for the 2nd Annual Del City Fire Department Summer Safety Day. The pool was filled with people from all ages interested in learning more about fire and water safety. Firefighters provided safety related items, cooked hotdogs for everyone and interacted with the patrons. Attendance during the event was around 240, with 400 hotdogs, 200 bags of chips, 200 sports bottles and 30 gallons of drink served. One of the highlights of the day was a swimming demonstration by Brandi Ylla, a certified Infant Swim instructor. She demonstrated an infant self-rescue with 10month old Ashton. Her technique, Infant Swim Resource (ISR), is designed to teach infants how to stay alive if they ever wander or fall into a swimming pool. Infants as young as 6months old can be taught breathing techniques, rolling techniques, and how to float. For more information about ISR, contact Brandi at b.ylla@infantswim.com. The event wouldn't have been successful if it weren't for the hard work of Del City Firefighters and donations from

The Summer Safety Day has become an annual event for the Fire Department. Attendance doubled from last year, and plans are underway for next year.
